









Music for all Number of students per instrument

Methodology

Population

From 7 year old children with reading and writing skills
to 18 year olds who have finished their formal education.

There are 5 levels:
Students learn at their own pace

Academic Curriculum

- Main instrument
- Secondary instrument
- Choir
- Orchestra

Level 1-4 hours classes per week taught in 30 minute sessions each

Groups of 10-40 students

- Choir- 2 hours class
- Percussion-1 hour class
- Recorder-1 hour class

Level 2-4 hours classes per week taught in 30 minute sessions each

- Main instrument-I hour class
- Choir-2 hours classes
- Orchestra- l hour class

Level 3-6 hours classes per week taught in 30 minute sessions each

- Main instrument-l hour class
- Secondary instrument-1 hour class
- Choir- 2 hours classes
- Orchestra- 2 hours classes

Level 4- 10 hours classes per week taught in 30 minute sessions each

- Main instrument-I hour class
- Secondary instrument-l hour class
- Choir-2 hours classes
- Orchestra- 2 hours classes
- Collective chamber music- 2 hours classes
- Musical pedagogy-2 hours classes

Level 5-101/2 hours per week classes

- Main instrument-l hour class
- Collective secondary instrument-1 hour class
- Choir-2 hours classes
- Orchestra- 2 hours classes
- Chamber music- 2 hours classes
- Pedagogíy- 2 hours classes
- Community service (CS) 140 annual hours
